## Questions For Deeper Thinking:

- In verse 1, what does the passage tell us about how Jesus felt about his followers?
- How did Jesus demonstrate this love toward his disciples in this passage?
- What was Peter's reaction and how did Jesus respond?
- What command does Jesus give to his disciples after he washes their feet? And what reason did Jesus give for his actions? (verses 14-15)
- Feet—especially 2000 years ago—were messy and gross and embarrassing. What are the "feet" in your life today? What part of your life would you consider messy and gross and embarrassing?
- How is Jesus showing you that he cares about that part of your life?
- What are the messy, gross, and embarrassing parts of your friends', family's, and neighbors' lives?
- How is Christ calling you to draw near to those?
